CSW66 Forum: Women in Ukrainian War and UN Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security which was hosted by Zonta International and Zonta District 27. Luba Maksymovych from the Zonta Club of Lviv-Zamok shared her first-hand experiences of women and children fleeing their homes to take refuge and accept resources from Center Women's Perspectives, a non-governmental organization in Lviv which she founded. Luba was bravely candid about the extreme challenges, heartbreaking deaths and nonstop hardships the people of Ukraine are facing, especially women and children.

In her own words, Luba also told of her bond with Zonta. She spoke of the sisterhood as members have reached out to support her and offer her solidarity. Messages poured in the chat assuring Luba that she is not alone. It is because of this bond that Zonta is so strong. We step in where needed and give all we can to make a difference.

Despite the hardship and uncertainty of current events, I know Zonta is a beacon of hope: the love and care our Zontians have for one another and beyond shines brightly even in these darkest of times. Thank you for all that you do, and for being a part of the Zonta fellowship.


