



Chapter 7

District 03 – North America¹

Since 1920, Zonta International has grouped clubs in districts. The following is information on the formation of District 03. As of 19 January 2020, District 03 had 28 clubs in six states in the United States

Timeline of district history highlights

1924: In September, the Confederation had 31 clubs with 1,520 members.

The districts were: The East District, South District, West District and West Coast District. The Zonta clubs of Washington, Hoboken and New York belonged to the South District.

1925: The revised district plan comprised five districts designated A, B, C, D and E.²

1929: the designation of the districts was changed from letters to Roman numerals. The Zonta clubs of Hoboken (no number found) and Jersey City in New Jersey (no number found), the Zonta Club of New York (number 0020), and the Zonta Club of Washington, D.C. (number 0017) belonged to District I Region B, which comprised 14 clubs.

1930: In addition to the Zonta clubs of Hoboken, New York and Washington, the following clubs belonged to District I, Region B: Annapolis, Maryland (0058); Englewood, New Jersey; Frederick, Maryland (0094); Newark, New Jersey (0093); New Rochelle, New York; Penn Yan, New York; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (0068).

1934: District III became effective by division of District I.

1934–1946: Clubs from the present district 03 belonged to District III, Region B.

1947: The district plan was revised. District III, Region B, which was established in 1934, continued and comprised 16 clubs.

1952: 22 clubs.

1957: 31 clubs.

1963: 31 clubs.

1968: 33 clubs.

1970: 35 clubs.

1978: District III encompassed two areas, designated as Area North and Area South, with a total of 33 clubs.

1980: District III encompassed four areas, designated as Area 01 (formerly Area North), Area 02 (formerly Area South), Area 03 and Area 04, with a total of 32 clubs.

1990: The Zonta International Board changed the designation from Roman numerals to Arabic numerals. District III became District 03.

1990: 37 clubs and 1,350 members.³

2002: 36 clubs.

2008: 34 clubs in four Areas.

2016: 29 clubs in four Areas. Area 01 had seven clubs, Area 02 had seven clubs, Area 03 had eight clubs and Area 04 had seven clubs.

Advocacy

District 03 Advocacy Chairman Bobbie Cardillo introduced the district to a project of which the members are very proud. The project, called Advocacy Day on Capitol Hill, invited Zontians and members of like-minded non-governmental organizations to go to Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. in June 2017 to visit their state's legislatures. Appointments were made in advance and there were talking points on pieces of legislation. Members focused on the bipartisan Campus Accountability and Safety Act and the Equal Rights Amendment. Members told the senators that Zonta supports both acts and asked them to commit to support and co-sponsor them.

After a successful first visit to Capitol Hill, a second was held on Women's Day, 8 March 2018.⁸

All District Clubs are encouraged to take part in the Zonta Says No initiative and the annual 16 Days of Activism from 25 November-10 December. Zonta clubs in district 03 take local and national actions to influence the making and implementation of laws, as well as changing gender-based attitudes and behaviors to end violence against women.

Zonta clubs across the district sponsor the Rave Walk to fight domestic violence and abuse. Clubs that are geographically close to each other join together in the Spring and walk to raise community awareness of sexual abuse and domestic violence. Clubs have also joined Powher NY with fellow Zontians, city officials, legislators, and community leaders. They have also gathered on the steps of New York City Hall on Equal Pay Day to show support for equal pay for equal work for women.

From the beginning, District 03 Zonta Clubs have supported local programs for women. The first service project was a financial gift in the year 1922 to the Neighborhood House of Washington D.C. from the newly chartered Washington D.C. Club. A scholarship program was initiated in January 1924 which began District 3's long history of a strong commitment to women's education. Early club scholarships helped women to continue careers in public health nursing, training for Foreign service (war years), and for graduating seniors to attend secondary education. Today, clubs award scholarships that support undergraduate women planning to pursue a degree in areas such as business, engineering, healthcare, the law, education, technology, mathematics, or the sciences. Scholarships are awarded to women who have survived domestic or sexual abuse and are re-entering the workforce. Today the 28 clubs support women's shelters, non-profit agencies and local charities that help women in need in their local communities. Across the district, all clubs as part of their service projects donate to the Zonta Foundation. Yearly, each club donates one third of funds raised to the various Zonta Service Funds: Amelia Earhart, Rose Fund, ZISVAW, YWPA, and The Jane Klausman award for Women in Business.

Inter-district Meetings

In 2005 Governors Sue Halsey (District 3) and Evelyn Haskell (District 12) volunteered to work on the Inter-district meeting, hosted in Denver, Colorado. Glenne Harding, Zonta International Membership (OMC) Committee Chairman, and Jacquie Gudmundsen, OMCCommittee member, joined the organizing team. The event featured keynote addresses from:

- Glenne Harding, Zonta OMC Chairman – “Membership: Where We are Today”, and
- Karen Beeks, founder, Global Partnership for Humanity – “Trafficking in Humans: A Problem Among Us”.

In 2017 Judy Johnston, past District 3 governor, offered to host the Inter-district meeting in Washington D.C. Her local committee also planned an advocacy action on Capitol Hill for United States Zontians to meet with congressional representatives. President Sonja Hönig Schough convened the Board in Washington D.C., and all board members participated in the inter-district meeting. Sonja as President, and President-Elect, Susanne von Bassewitz, opened the event on Saturday with their presentations.
